EPIPHANY 2024

Epiphany means "appearance" or "manifestation," highlighting three significant signs marking the divinity of Jesus.

- Star led Maji- Matthew 2
- Water into Wine- John 2
- Baptism of our Lord- Mark 1

All of these narratives demonstrate the divinity of Jesus. We will begin this year with Baptism of our Lord Sunday. The other two Epiphany miracle texts will come in upcoming years as the scripture readings are on a 3-year rotation cycle.

Baptism of our Lord Sunday and Transfiguration of our Lord Sunday bookend the Epiphany Season. Both are "festival" or "high" Sundays on the liturgical landscape. Notice, there are 6 Sundays listed here. I have decided to divide seasonally rather than monthly this year, as Lent will arrive soon this year! Paradoxically, Ash Wednesday falls on Valentines Day this year!

February 4 th	Jesus heals many at Simon's house	Mark 1: 29-39
February 11th	Transfiguration of our Lord	Mark 9: 2-9


All in all, a great trip with two of the most important men in my life. It's probably time for us to do it again!!


